Zurich to grant a sponsor's exemption to Martin Rominger for the 2007 Zurich Classic of New Orleans

Zurich Financial Services Group (Zurich) has granted a sponsor's exemption to Martin Rominger, the leading Swiss Golf professional, to play at the PGA event Zurich Classic of New Orleans from April 16 to 22, 2007. It is the second time in a row that Zurich grants him that exemption. Last year, Martin Rominger was the first Swiss golfer to participate in the US PGA Tour in New Orleans.

Martin Rominger says: "I am very glad I got the sponsor's exemption to play in the Zurich Classic. My experience last year was great. Since then, I feel that I have learned a lot and I am looking forward to competing again in New Orleans with the best on the biggest stage of Golf."

Martin Rominger is currently playing his second season on the Asian Tour. He retained his playing rights in his rookie year 2006 and improved his ranking by finishing second at the Asian Qualifying School for the 2007 season. Furthermore, he represented Switzerland in the 2006 World Cup in Barbados finishing a creditable twelfth with his partner against the world's best players.
